Noonan in memory of his mother, continues its proud tradition of supporting non-profit organizations and academic institutions that serve children with disabilities within their geographic area of interest of Greater Boston.

The Noonan Research Fund supports innovative clinical and service system research and demonstration projects designed to improve the quality of life for children with disabilities relevant to the Noonan focus.

***Important Note: The Noonan Research Fund 2020 grant cycle will support two-year/\$160,000 projects in a 2-stage application process and is no longer offering one-year funding opportunities.***

## Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicants must hold a position within a non-profit organization or institution.
- Project must address the target population age range of birth through 23 years old.
- The majority of research subjects must be within the Fund's geographic area of interest (Refer to list of eligible cities and towns in Application Guidelines).
- Neither an academic faculty position nor an advanced degree is required for eligibility.
