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
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This grants program, Massachusetts Community Violence Intervention Capacity Building Initiative (15PBJA-23-GK-05187-CVIP), is supported by the Bureau of Justice Assistance of the U.S. Department of Justice as part of a financial assistance award totaling \$4,000,000 with 100 percent funded by BJA/DOJ.

### Technology Overview



#### **CVIPI**

The Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention Initiative (CVIPI) program provides funding to prevent and reduce violent crime in communities by supporting comprehensive, evidence-based violence intervention and prevention programs, including efforts to address gang and gun violence, based on partnerships between community residents, local government agencies, victim service providers, community-based organizations (CBO), law enforcement, hospitals, researchers, and other community stakeholders. The overall goal of the initiative is to reduce violence by persons at high risk for violence.

# The MCVI-CBI grants program has two primary goals:

- 1. To support organizations building or strengthening their ability to offer the full spectrum of services of violence prevention and intervention.
- 2. To build organizational capacity, deepen and expand reach, and support infrastructure that strengthens organizational operations and broader field sustainability.



# Organizations must either:

**Currently** conduct direct intervention that engages proven-risk individuals most likely to be directly impacted by gun violence

#### OR

Plan to use these funds to deepen their engagement of proven-risk priority populations to reduce gun violence through direct intervention



#### Awards

• **Amount:** \$250,000 each

• **Duration:** 10/1/2024 – 9/30/2026

• Number of awards available: 5

 Expectation: Full participation in extensive Training, Technical Assistance, and other Capacity Building Activities



## What does that mean Mo?

Grantee organizations will participate in training and other activities as a cohort including:


- leadership and professional development;
- practitioner and supervisor trainings;
- communities of practice;
- capacity assessments
  - + subsequent supports for backend functions including:
    - Fundraising and sustainability
    - organizational development
    - financial management
    - human resources, and other topics
- regional and national convenings
- and other activities....



#### Who Can Apply?

- Community based organizations
- Partnerships and coalitions
- Municipal bodies in partnership with a CBO

**Especially:** small community based organizations doing CVI work with deep roots in the community, making powerful impact, but lacking infrastructure or support to take on large funding opportunities – this is a capacity building grant.





#### 501(c)3 status

Massachusetts-based nonprofit organizations or groups with a 501(c)3 fiscal sponsor, that work in communities where there is a disproportionate impact of gun violence.

If your organization <u>does not</u> yet have a 501(c)3 status, <u>we welcome</u> you to complete the LOI and share your support needs within the application.



#### NON Eligible Uses

- Capital expenditures
- Proposals by organizations that do not currently work in the violence prevention space
- Proposals focused on populations other than proven-risk individuals
- Proposals that solely outline existing activities, with no programmatic or operational capacitybuilding element
- Proposals that focus on criminal justice-based or carceral approaches to gun violence
- Hospital-based intervention programs

#### This is a cost reimbursement grant

Payment is by ACH (electronic funds transfer)

#### **Draft of the Process:**

- Larger organizations will do traditional cost reimbursement process
- Smaller orgs
  - Grantee requests a cash drawdown
    - Notes cash on hand, amount needed for expenses, amount requested
    - It is our expectation that you will draw down monthly for expenses
  - Quarterly reporting will reconcile all expenses:
    - Time and cost allocation for staff
    - Programmatic expenses including supplies, travel, etc.
    - Operational expenses and indirect


